This transfer institution has agreed to accept the specified associate's degree from Florida State College at Jacksonville. The Florida State College at Jacksonville graduate will be accepted at the junior level, and is required to complete the equivalent of two years of full-time coursework to complete the specified bachelor's degree.

It is very important to make sure that your Program of Study at Florida State College at Jacksonville is Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Applied Science Degree. If you do not plan to transfer to this specific transfer institution, please follow the Program of Study, as specified in the Florida State College at Jacksonville Catalog.

Upon graduation from Florida State College at Jacksonville, Northcentral University (NCU) will accept up to 68 lower level semester credits, or 90 semester hours of total academic credit, from any AA, AS, or AAS degree towards the BA Psychology. The transfer credits will be applied toward meeting the general education requirement, major requirements, and elective requirements. Students must complete a minimum of 30 upper-division semester credit hours from Northcentral University to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology.

Please contact your advisor or counselor to request the 3 + 1 POS to be applied to your program of study records. Please review the information on the Transfer Services 3 + 1 webpage for further instructions.

General Education Notes:

- Please review the Florida State College at Jacksonville Catalog for General Education Requirements (GER).
- CLAS (College Level Academic Skills): Satisfaction of these skills is a graduation requirement for the associate in arts degree in the state college system of Florida. Students must meet one of the approved exemptions – see the catalog for more information.
- The state university Foreign Language Requirement does not apply to students transferring to Northcentral University.
- All General Education courses require a grade of “C” or above.

Prerequisite and Elective Notes:

- All prerequisite courses require a grade of “C” or above.
- A major prerequisite course may satisfy both Florida State College at Jacksonville General Education Requirements and NCU Major Prerequisites.
Please review the General Education Requirements and talk with an advisor.
- Electives must have the appropriate AA (for AA degree students), AS (for AS degree students), or AAS (for AAS degree students) notation at the end of the course description in Florida State College at Jacksonville catalog.

Other Notes:

- All Florida State College at Jacksonville coursework must be completed with a grade of “C” or above in order to be transferred to Northcentral University.
- No more than 68 semester hours of lower level credit, or 90 semester hours of total academic credit, may be transferred toward completion of the degree requirements at NCU.
- If you do not plan to transfer to this specific transfer institution, please follow the Program of Study, as specified in the College Catalog.
