This transfer institution has agreed to accept the specified associate's degree from FCCJ. The FCCJ graduate can transfer 90 semester hours to Nova Southeastern University, and will then simultaneously complete bachelor and masters coursework at Nova Southeastern University. By following this specified coursework and any current FCCJ and Nova Southeastern University requirements, and Centralized Application Service for Physician Assistant (CASPA) Admission Requirements, the successful student can earn an Associate of Arts at FCCJ and a Bachelor of Science in Applied Professional Studies in Health Professions Studies and Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant at Nova Southeastern University. The following chart shows the specific courses that the FCCJ student is required to take to meet the guidelines of the articulation agreement with the transfer institution.

Nova Southeastern University will admit students to professional level status towards a physician assistant Master in Medical Science degree who complete the articulated pre-requisite requirements at FCCJ, and all other admissions criteria. Nova Southeastern University retains sole responsibility for establishing the academic and other criteria that students must meet in order to fulfill its own entrance and graduation requirements and in evaluating student applications for admission. Incoming students must meet all entry requirements for the Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program. Acceptance into the physician assistant program does not guarantee successful completion of course requirements, leading to a degree of Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant. After discussing this program with your advisor, please ask your FCCJ advisor to add the Program of Study code (32NOV) and the unique 3 + 2 Intended Transfer Major (612NOV) to your student record.

It is very important to make sure that your Program of Study at FCCJ is Associate of Arts degree. If you do not plan to transfer to this specific transfer institution, please follow the Program of Study, as specified in the FCCJ College Catalog.

General Timeline

In Years One through Three of the Physician Assistant 3 + 2.25 Dual Admission Program, Florida Community College Jacksonville students will take and complete all Florida Community College Jacksonville AA requirements and all prerequisite courses (total of 90 semester credit hours). Following the curriculum below prepares students for entry into NSU's Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program, while working toward a baccalaureate degree. In the fall semester of Year Three, Florida Community College Jacksonville students will apply to NSU for admission into the Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant.

Following the curriculum requirements in this agreement does not guarantee admission to the NSU program. The Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program is a competitive admissions program. Please see important GPA requirements below (page 3, Prerequisite and Elective Notes). Students will be asked to meet with a specific

advisor at FCCJ to sign the Student Acceptance Agreement for the Dual Admission program, acknowledging an understanding the requirements.

If accepted by NSU, then in Year Four, that is the senior year of undergraduate education, Florida Community College Jacksonville students will complete the requirements of a NSU baccalaureate degree (not to exceed 75 credit hours), specifically the BS degree in Applied Professional Studies in Health Professions Studies (APS-HPS). (The bachelor's should be completed after completion of the first year of the PA program, but no later than the end of the second year of the PA program.) Concurrently, in Year Four, students will begin their Physician Assistant studies at NSU, and the PA courses will be accepted by NSU towards the NSU baccalaureate degree. NSU will grant to the students an undergraduate degree upon their successful completion of all Florida Community College Jacksonville and NSU requirements.

In Years Five and Six, students will continue their course work in NSU's Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program, including clinical rotations. Students will be eligible to receive a Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant upon successful completion of all NSU requirements.

General Education Notes:

- Please review the Florida Community College Catalog for General Education Requirements (GER).
- Students must meet the NSU General Education Requirements.
- CLAST (College Level Academic Skills Test): The CLAST is a graduation requirement for the associate in arts degree in the community college system of Florida. Passing all four subsets of the CLAST exam, or satisfying a CLAST exemption, is a requirement for meeting the associate of arts degree graduation requirement.
- The state Foreign Language Requirement does not apply to students transferring to Nova Southeastern University.
- All General Education courses require a grade of "C" or above.

Prerequisite and Elective Notes:

- All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better, however students must have earned a 3.0 overall minimum GPA for the 90 semester credits hours and a 3.0 minimum GPA for the natural and behavioral sciences courses.
- Students applying to NSU through the Physician Assistant 3 + 2.25 Dual Admission Program must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and a natural and behavioral science GPA of 3.0, upon completion of the 90 credit hours (AA + 30 credit hours) toward the Bachelor of Science. Applicants must demonstrate, to NSU's satisfaction, the ability to complete their baccalaureate degree by the end of their first year at NSU. All college courses attempted are included in NSU's calculation of student GPA. If a student has a 2.8 or higher, but less than a 3.0 GPA, they can still apply to the NSU program, however the applicant may not be considered part of the FCCJ applicant cohort.
- A major prerequisite course may satisfy both FCCJ General Education Requirements and NSU entrance requirements. Please review the General Education Requirements and talk with an advisor.

Other Notes:

- Students must complete the Information Literacy Assessment requirement prior to graduation from FCCJ.
- The Physician Assistant program does not permit grade forgiveness in calculating GPA, based on Centralized Application Service for Physician Assistant (CASPA) guidelines. Therefore the FCCJ GPA will be re-calculated in the admission process. All attempted courses will be included in calculating an overall and Natural and behavioral sciences GPA. The NSU Admission Committee will try to take into consideration a student's course attempts/repeats, and grade improvement over time. Students must have earned a 3.0 overall minimum GPA for the 90 semester credits hours and a 3.0 minimum GPA for the natural and behavioral sciences courses. All college courses attempted are included in NSU's calculation of student GPA. If a student has a 2.8 or higher, but less than a 3.0 GPA, they can still apply to the NSU program, however the applicant may not be considered part of the FCCJ applicant cohort.
- NSU will accept 90 hours for transfer into the BS Applied Professional Studies in Health Professions Studies degree.
- No later than the first semester after completing the associate's degree, students must take the Graduate Record Test (GRE) and receive acceptable scores in the Verbal and Quantitative sections as determined by NSU. It is the student's responsibility to have the official test scores forwarded to the Office of Admissions in Health Professions Division at NSU.
- Students interested in the Physician Assistant program of study will be required to complete a CASPA and supplemental application to NSU's Office of Admissions in the Health Professions Division no later than the first semester after completing the associate's degree.
- FCCJ students accepted to the Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant Program will complete the Bachelor's degree in 2 years at NSU while working on the Master's degree program requirements. Students who are not accepted to the Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program should contact their FCCJ advisor or counselor immediately to determine if the student should continue taking the 'third year' courses at FCCJ at this point in time and to explore other transfer opportunities to earn a bachelor's degree, such as completing the BS degree in Applied Professional Studies in Health Professions Studies (APS-HPS).
- Students who complete their FCCJ course work under the terms of the catalog in effect during the term of their registration must graduate within five years or they will automatically be reassigned to the FCCJ catalog in effect during their fifth year.
- Upon completion of the first three years, students must maintain continuous enrollment and transfer directly to NSU within two semesters of the last term of enrollment at Florida Community College at Jacksonville. Continuous enrollment is defined as enrollment not interrupted by non-attendance for more than three consecutive terms. If students have not maintained continuous enrollment, they can still apply to the NSU program, but may not be considered part of the FCCJ applicant cohort. If the FCCJ student has stopped out from enrollment for more than three consecutive terms during the 90 credit hours required for admission to the NSU PA program, then the student is not eligible to compete for the FCCJ cohort seats. These students can complete in the general pool of NSU Jacksonville PA applicants.
- If you do not plan to transfer to this specific transfer institution, please follow the Program of Study, as specified in the College Catalog.

NSU PA Admissions Criteria

- Students must complete the 90 semester hours of credit at FCCJ before beginning the dual admission bachelor's/master's program, including the prerequisite courses listed in the FCCJ Transfer Advising Sheet for this articulation. Official transcripts must be submitted to NSU.
- Students applying for admission into the Master of Medical Sciences Physician Assistant program of study must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and a science GPA of 3.0 or above, upon completion of the required 90 credit hours as described in Appendix A (on the Transfer Advising sheet posted on the Transfer Services webpage http://www.fccj.edu/transferservices/spec_grad_prgm.html). (All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better, however students must have earned a 3.0 overall minimum GPA for the 90 semester credits hours and a 3.0 minimum GPA for the natural and behavioral sciences courses). All college courses attempted are included in NSU's calculation of student GPA. If a student has a 2.8 or higher, but less than a 3.0 GPA, they can still apply to the NSU program, however the applicant may not be considered part of the FCCJ applicant cohort. If a student's GPA falls below this requirement during his/her course of study at Florida Community College at Jacksonville, FCCJ will issue a letter of warning to the student and notify NSU's College of Allied Health of the warning. The student will have until the end of the second semester of year two to meet the minimum requirement of the necessary GPA. If the student is not in compliance with the required GPA by the end of year two, the student will be notified in writing that he/she will no longer be considered for any of the twenty-five (25) available 'FCCJ cohort' seats in the Master of Medical Sciences Physician Assistant Program at the College of Allied Health. If a student has a 2.8 or higher, but less than a 3.0 GPA, they can still apply to the NSU program, however the applicant may not be considered part of the FCCJ applicant cohort.
- Submit NSU PA application.
- Submit official GRE general test scores to the EPS dept, attention Physician Assistant Admissions, no later than the first semester after completing the associate degree. NSU's school code is 5522.
- Three letters of evaluation or recommendation. One letter must be sent from an individual, other than a relative or friend, such as an academic advisor, professor, coworker, or supervisor. The other two letters of recommendation/evaluation must be from health care professionals (neither of which can be a relative or friend), one of whom must be a physician or PA.
- Submit to background check conducted by NSU Health Professions Division.
- Participate in a personal face-to-face interview, if requested by application committee.

- Screening committee will review all transcripts and all course attempts. NSU does not have grade forgiveness. All attempted courses will be included in calculating an overall and Natural and behavioral sciences GPA. The NSU Admission Committee will try to take into consideration a student's course attempts/repeats, and grade improvement over time. Students must have earned a 3.0 overall minimum GPA for the 90 semester credits hours and a 3.0 minimum GPA for the natural and behavioral sciences courses. All college courses attempted are included in NSU's calculation of student GPA.
- Students must also have their own laptop upon entering the program and show evidence of computer skills through coursework or self-study prior to end of first term.

Is Admission for FCCJ students guaranteed?

- Nova Southeastern University retains sole responsibility for establishing the academic and other criteria that students must meet in order to fulfill its own entrance and graduation requirements and in evaluating student applications for admission. Incoming NSU students must meet all entry requirements for the Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program. Acceptance into the physician assistant program does not guarantee successful completion of course requirements, leading to a degree of Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant.
- Following the curriculum requirements listed in the articulation/transfer advising sheet does not guarantee admission to the NSU program. The Master of Medical Science in Physician Assistant program is a competitive admissions program. Students will be asked to meet with a specific advisor at FCCJ to sign the Student Acceptance Agreement for the Dual Admission program, acknowledging an understanding the requirements. Contact information about the FCCJ advisor for the program will be announced soon.

What is the profile of the successful applicant to the NSU PA Program? (according to the NSU PA website)

- combination of life, educational and work experience that shows a commitment to patient care, an understanding of the PA profession and the ability to perform in a demanding academic and professional setting.
- Although not required, health care experience is highly recommended. This experience can be either paid or volunteer and should include exposure to mid level practitioners.
- Our applicants at the established NSU PA programs have an average of 30+ months of health care experience. Additionally many former applicants gained valuable information from the material they had access to as Associate Members of the American Academy of Physician Assistants.
- Past educational performance, while not indicative of current abilities, can predict performance in the program. Every attempt should be made to enhance overall and science course GPA prior to application. The first year is extremely demanding and the applicant will benefit by taking courses that simulate this type of education.

What is the Application process?

- For the first year (start date of June 2009), the local NSU PA program will NOT be using the national CASPA application system for Physician Assistant students. This year (for June 2009 start date) students must apply using the following instructions:
 - o Visit www.nova.edu
 - o Under "Colleges and Schools" look for "Graduate Programs." Below that click on "Allied Health and Nursing."
 - o Under "Future Students" (near the bottom of the page), click on "Apply Online."
 - o Create "new log on" to apply. Information for submitting application is located within the online application. If a student has questions about the application process, they can call the local Jacksonville NSU PA program at 245-8990.

There are multiple steps to the application and admission process. There will be an agreement that students must sign with FCCJ to get in the 'pipeline' for this program. Students should begin applying by October for admission to the June 2009 cohort. The application deadline is April 1, 2009. Application includes taking the GRE and Writing Assessment, an interview, and more.
